
**Lecture Description:** Although generative AI chatbots are widely used and often seen as helpful for mental health support, serious safety concerns remain, particularly in light of suicide-related incidents that highlight the risks of unregulated AI interventions. In response, policymakers have begun to act, including Illinois's 2025 Wellness and Oversight for Psychological Resources Act and a White House executive order on national AI policy.

In this seminar, Christopher Larrison, professor of social work at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign and IHSI affiliate, will examine the evidence behind these concerns and explore technically grounded safeguards that move beyond policy toward safe, clinically responsible uses of Gen-AI in mental health.

The Interdisciplinary Health Sciences Institute invites faculty, staff, students, practitioners, and others interested in exploring the use of large language models (LLMs) and Gen-AI chatbots in mental health services to attend this seminar!
